Psalm 27. Dominus illuminatio

- I. The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear: the Lord is the strength of my life; of whom then shall I be afraid?
- 2. When the wicked, even mine enemies and my foes, came upon me to eat up my flesh: they stumbled and fell.
- 3. Though an host of men were laid against me, yet shall not my heart be afraid: and though there rose up war against me, yet will I put my trust in him.
- 4. One thing have I desired of the Lord, which I will require : even that I may dwell in the house of

- 15. I should utterly have fainted: but that I believe verily to see the

goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.
